



2010 IGA Men's Amateur Championship

July 16-18, 2010
Clear Lake Country Club



PAR AND YARDAGE – Clear Lake Country Club will be set at approximately 5941 yards par 72 for all Flights.

TEES PLAYED – All Flights will play the IGA Tee Markers.

CLEAR LAKE COUNTRY CLUB – Built in 1929, with the second nine and clubhouse constructed in 1987. Clear Lake CC has hosted three State Amateur Championships.

DEFENDING CHAMPION – Chris Reinke (Ashton) 71-69-69—209 at Falcon Crest GC.

PRACTICE ROUNDS – Practice round will be available for \$20, call Clear Lake CC at (208) 543-4849 to make arrangements for a practice round.

CADDIES & CARTS – A player competing in the Championship may bring his own caddie, hire a caddie or carry his own bag. Players must make their own arrangements for caddies. Competitors may not caddie at any time during the competition. Caddies must register with the Starter and wear an IGA caddie bib. Competitors may ride in carts, but rentals are limited. Earliest entry date will determine allocation of available rental units. Cart fees will be paid for at the host club golf shop, payable to the host club. Cart fees are \$20 per rider.

PAIRINGS AND STARTING TIMES – Pairings and starting times for the first and second rounds will be available on the IGA website at www.theiga.org. Starting times for the third rounds will be available at the Clear Lake Golf Shop, and on our website by 9:00 p.m. Log on to the IGA website for the latest IGA Men's Amateur information during the Championship.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT – The competition will be a three day, 54-hole stroke play event, 18 holes each day. The lowest gross score will be the 2010 IGA Men's Amateur Champion.

RULES OF GOLF – Play will be governed by the Rules of Golf as provided by the USGA, 2010-11 USGA Rules Books will be available.

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES – Under Rule 14-3 a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if during a round a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions such as gradient, temperature and wind speed, the player is in breach of this rule and the penalty is disqualification regardless of whether any such additional functions were used.

FLIGHTS – The field of 144 players will be divided into three Flights for the Championship. Flights will be determined after entries close.

INCLEMENT WEATHER – In the event that inclement weather moves into the area, the IGA will suspend play by sounding air horns. When one long horn blast sounds, players should discontinue play and should seek shelter immediately. The IGA staff will evacuate players from the course. Everyone will be brought to a general location where the Tournament Director will make an announcement on resuming play.

DRESS CODE – Players must abide by IGA dress code. Dress code will also apply to caddies.

PACE OF PLAY – The IGA Pace of Play Policy shall govern regulation of the pace of play by IGA Rules Officials and Committee members.

PLAYOFF (if necessary) – If there is a tie for the lead at the end of 54 holes in the Championship Flight, a sudden death playoff will be held on #18 or #10.

CLOSE OF COMPETITION – The competition shall be deemed to have closed when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a trophy ceremony, when all scores have been posted and approved by the committee.

POSTING TOURNAMENT SCORES – All scores will be posted by the IGA staff. The IGA will post scores as a "T" score for IGA Championships. Players should not post their own scores on an IGA posting computer or online to avoid duplication.
